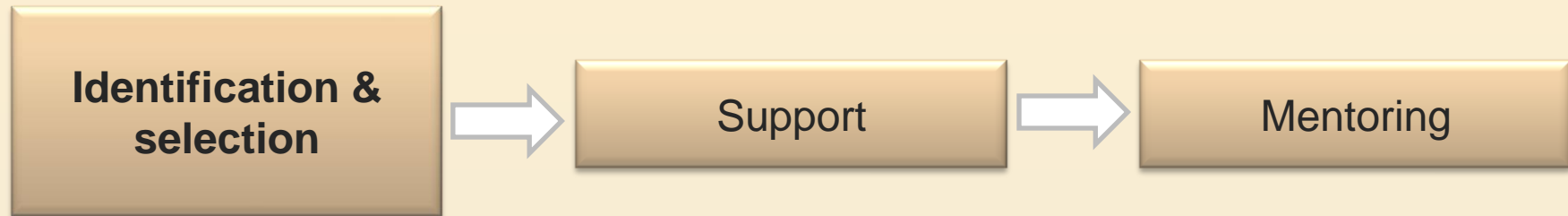

Identification & Selection

- Students identified from various sources like Schools, Alumni, Donors, Current students and Prerana.
- Selection process involves
 - One-One discussion with the students to understand their needs and interests
 - House visit to gauge the situation at home and financial capabilities of the family
 - Assessment to understand the strengths of student and to decide appropriate stream
 - Extra-curricular activities to make them comfortable in new environment
 - Student and Parent agreement form need to be signed before any support

Support:

- Full support
 - All expenses like fee, books, bus pass and additional courses
- Partial support
- Health aid

Mentoring:

- Weekend sessions at Bhavan Bangalore Press School which involves
 - Academic guidance
 - Personality development
 - Improve communications by conducting activities like pick & speak, presentation from the students etc.
 - Aptitude classes, GD, Mock Placements
- Regular one-one discussion with the students
- Meeting the parents at least yearly once

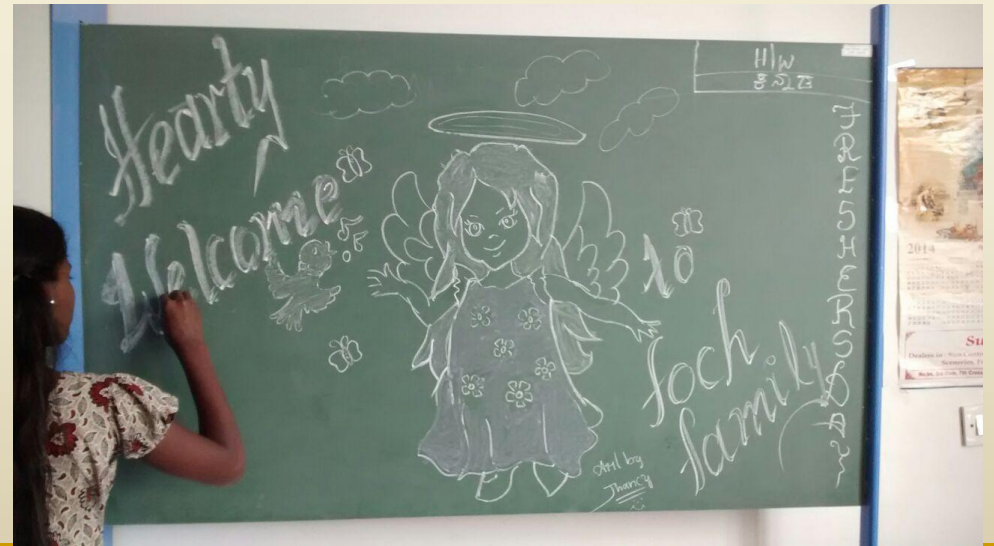

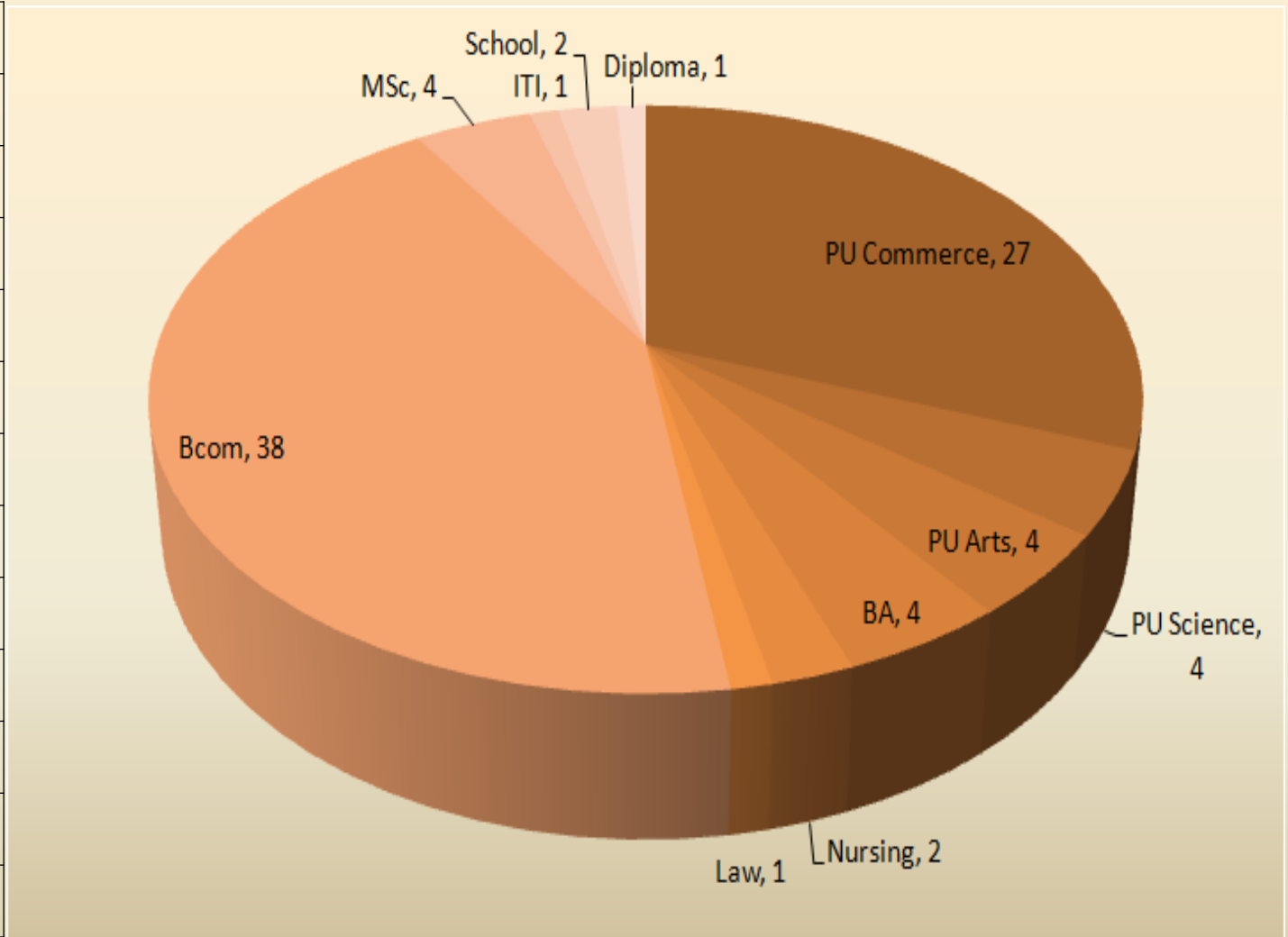

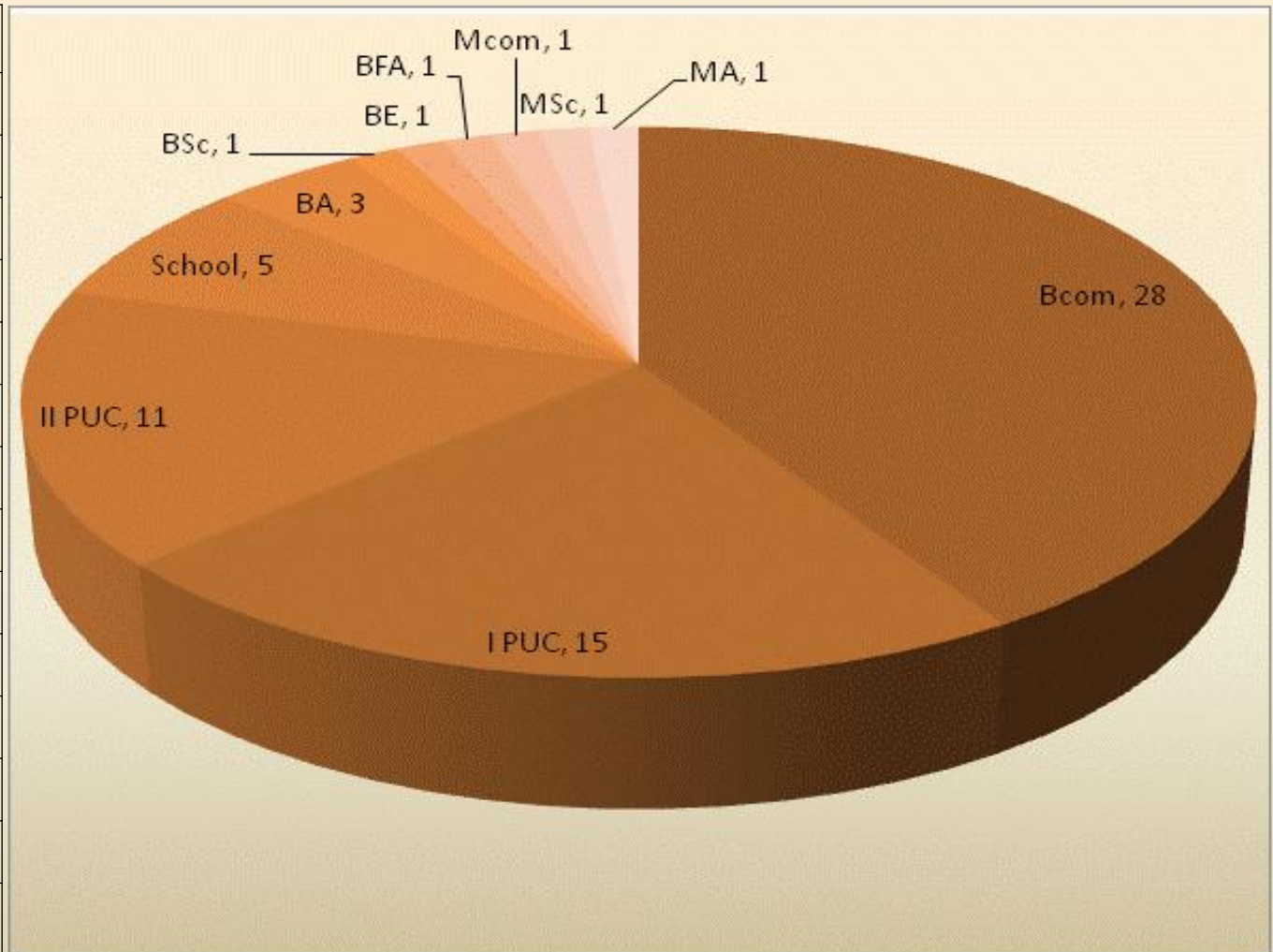
